West Chilcotin Demonstration Project (2004)

- Collaboration between Forest and Tourism Industries, First Nations and Local Residents.
- Intended to Create a new Landscape Planning Process, consistent with CCLUP

- Formulated the Foundation for the ECF application Objectives and Forest Management Principles.

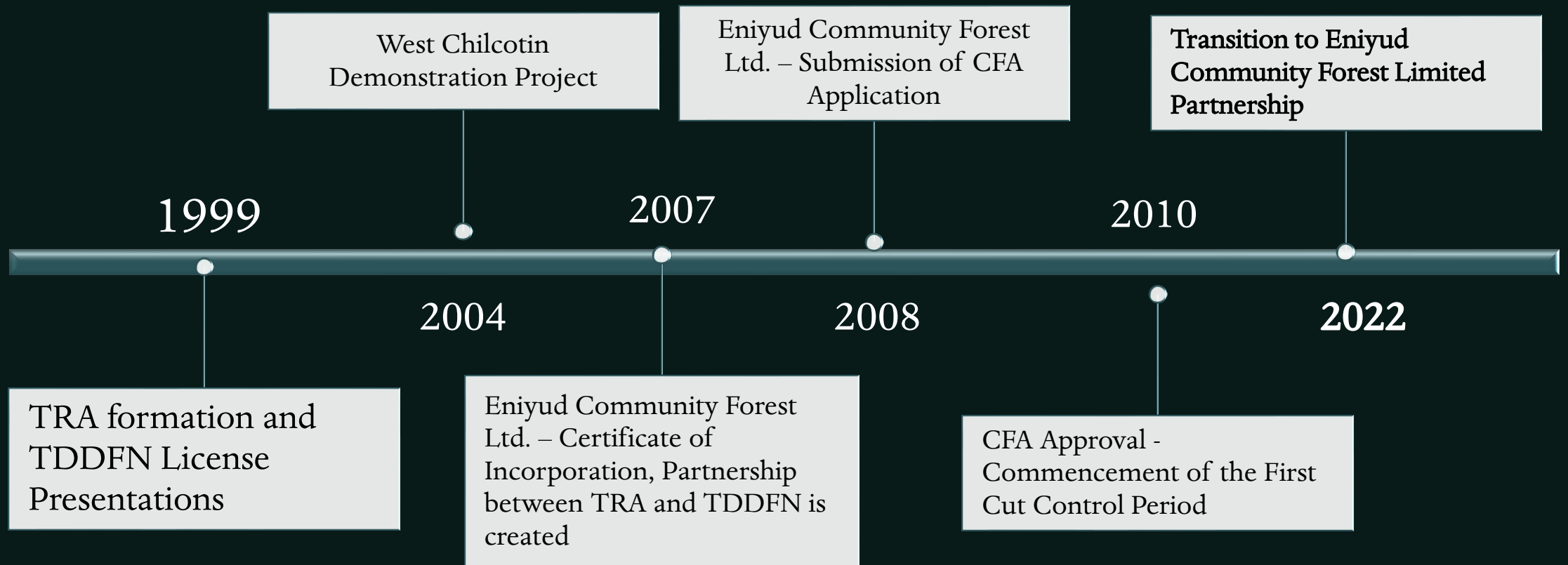




WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FOREST?

- Governed under the Forest Act.

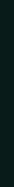
Corporate Timeline

Historical Market Conditions

- Low Commodity Price
\$200-\$400/1000mFB
- Expensive Variables
- High Delivered Log Costs
- Fixed Stumpage in low market condition

 - Increase liability and fixed Cost Ratio – Silviculture/Development/
Harvesting



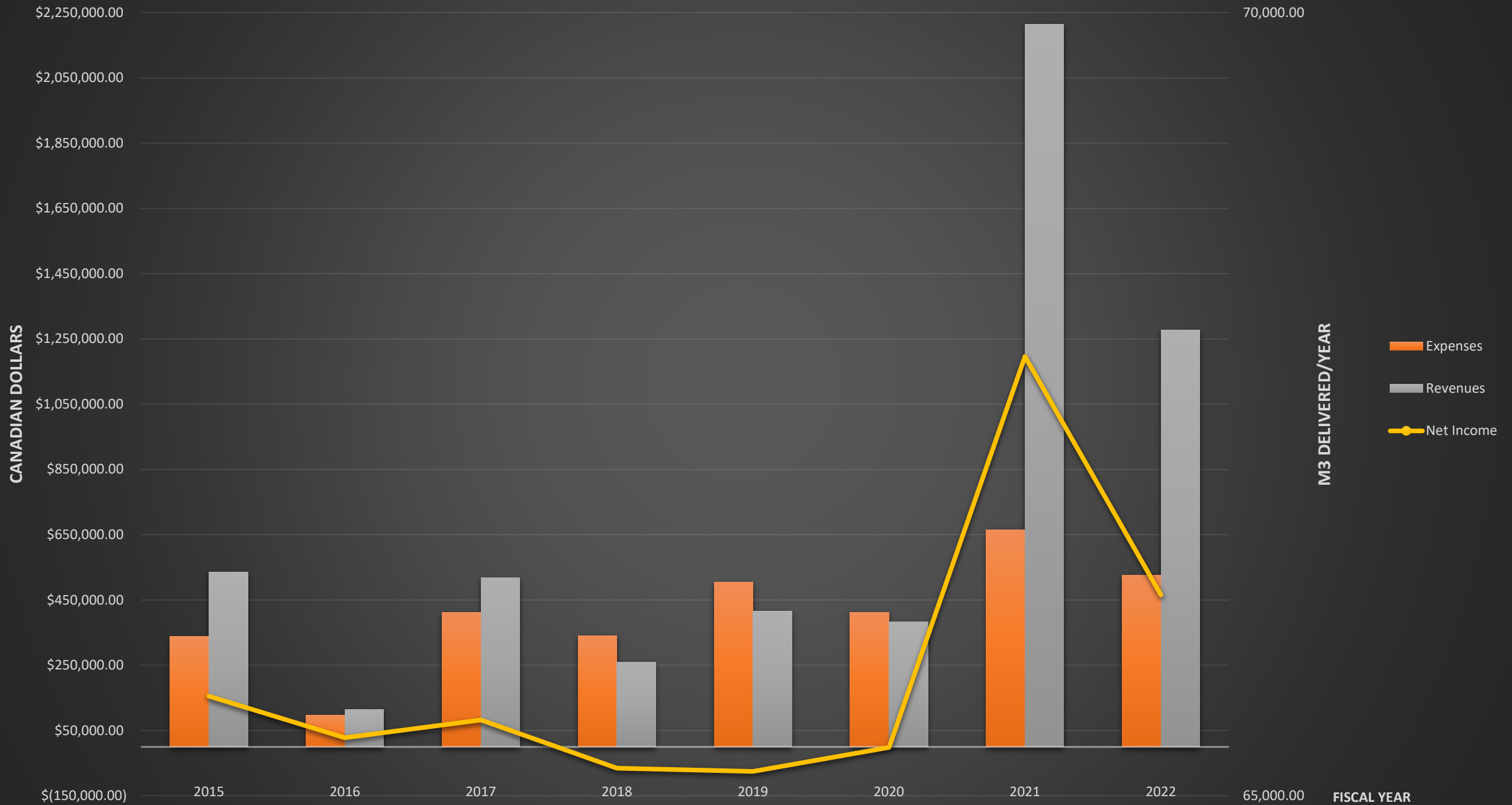


Current and Future Purchase Contracts

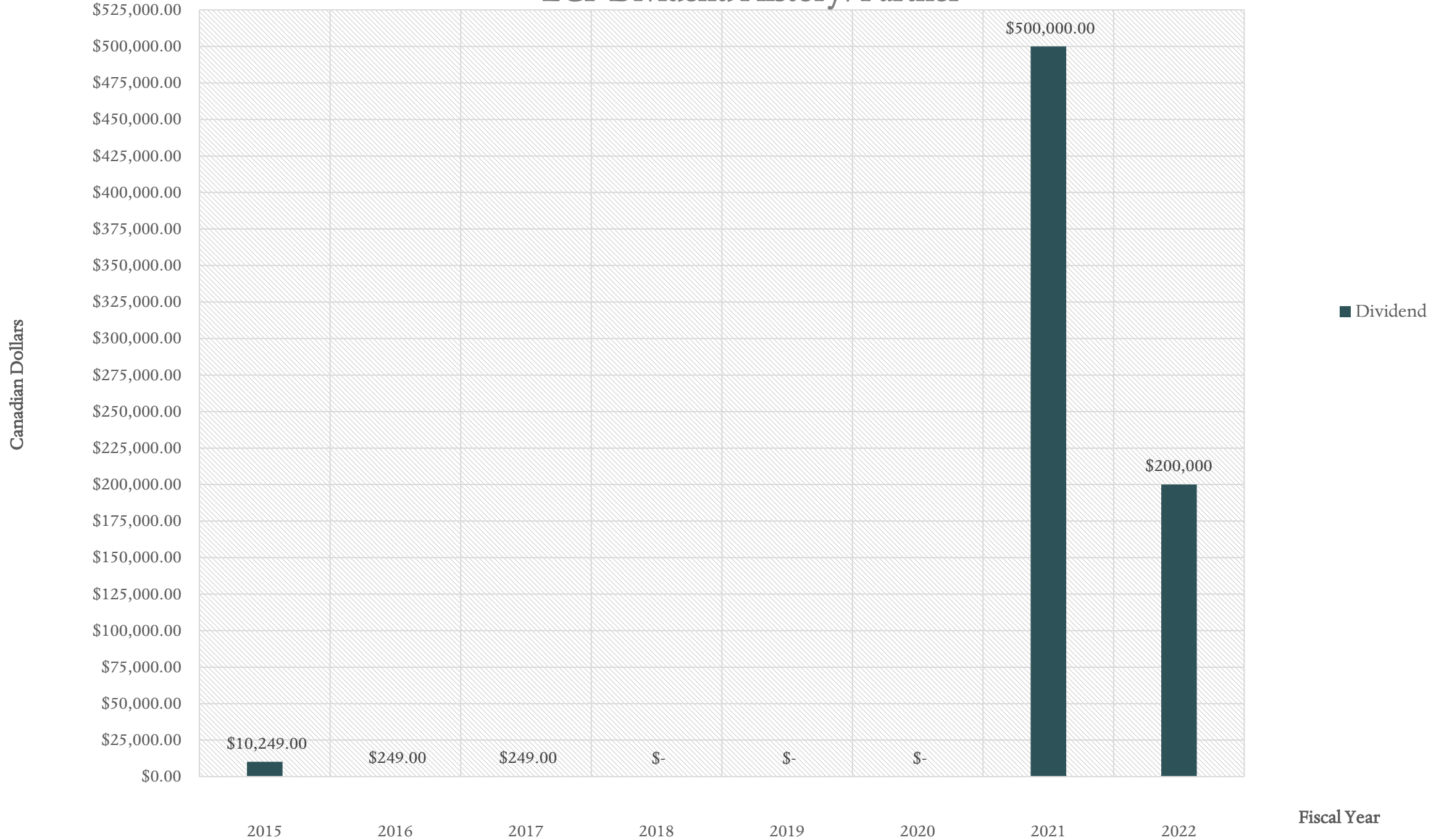
- Better Market Conditions

 - Limited Liability

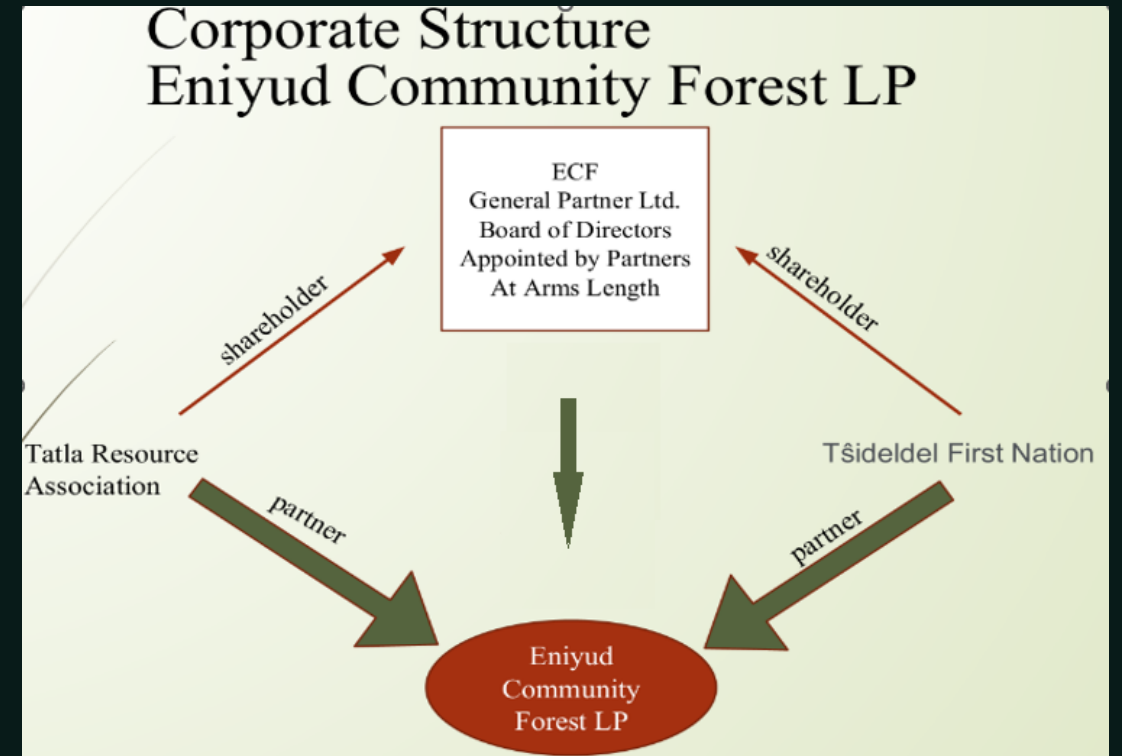

- Employs sub-contractors

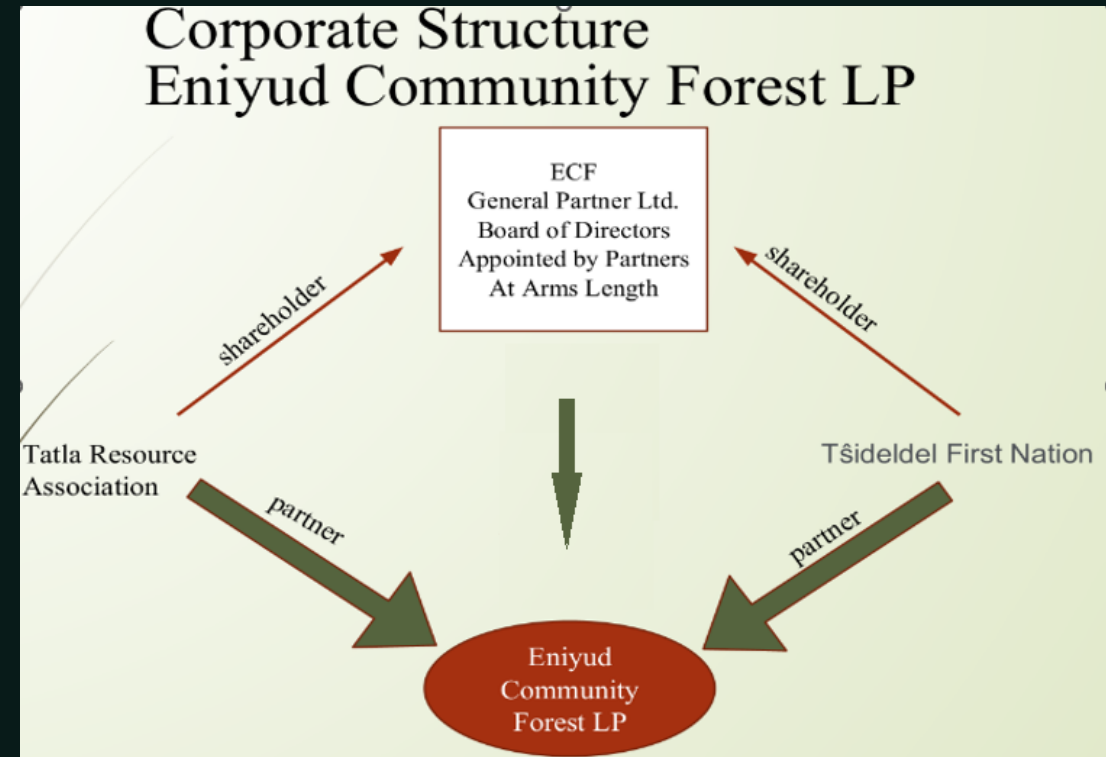
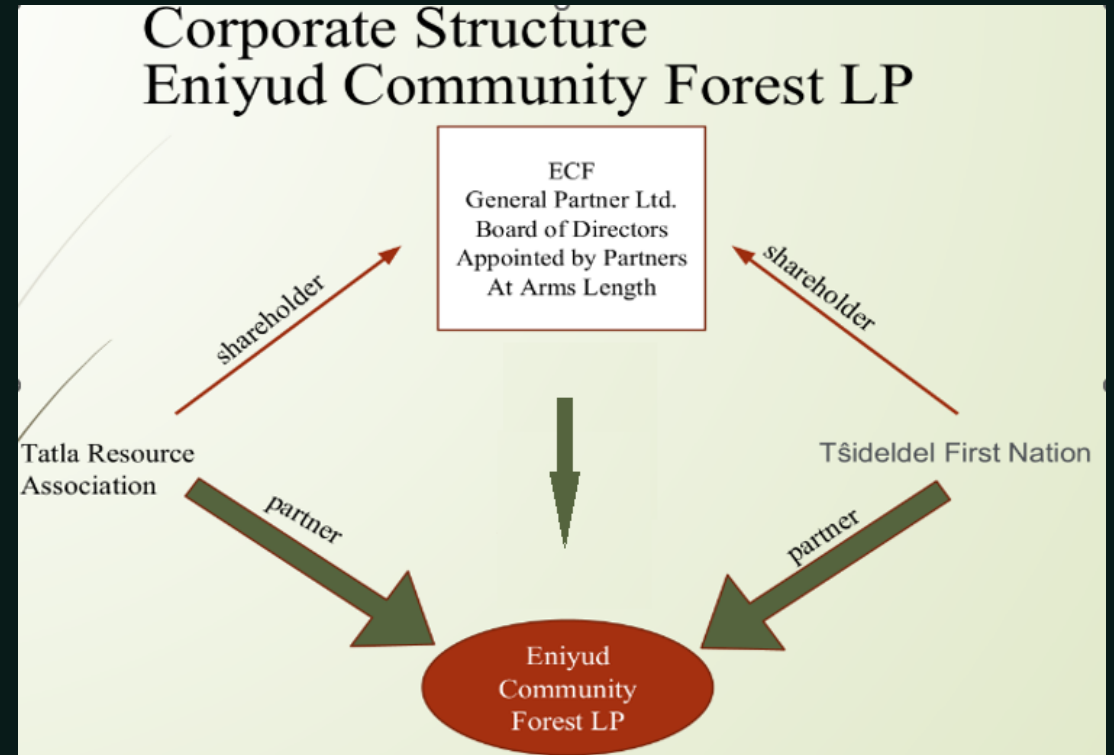

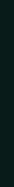
- LP has been Created and is active

Community Newsletter Update April 2022: - Eniyud Community Forest



Spring has arrived on the Eniyud Community Forest.

The ECF has completed harvesting for the winter season and are looking to capture uptrends in commodity market pricing by beginning shipments of fiber in Late May. We are hopefully to market 20-30,000m3 from CP012 in 2 blocks south of Eagle Lake that were harvested and hauled to a reload location. These blocks were harvested utilizing a clearcut with reserves silviculture system with significant group retention scattered throughout to protect visual resources. Retention was well done within the openings and the blocks are very clean, with scattered deciduous and spruce present throughout. Roadways are very wet and soft; we advise all public users to avoid these roadways until a time the running surface can support traffic.



Forest Stewardship Plan


- What Is a Forest Stewardship Plan?
 - Is approved by the Government
 - Objectives, Results and strategies are legal
 - Outlines how Management Plan Targets are Met.
 - Third version of FSP.
 - Current FSP expires end of 2024



Forest Stewardship Plan


- 2010 – First FSP Approved
- 2012 – LUO Amendment approved
- Expiry 2017
- 2016 – FSP Replacement Process initiated (Entire Region)
- Extended FSP for three years during process.
- FSP were pushed to be similar – Multi Licensee FSPs were encouraged
- Negotiated inclusion within approved FSP



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Key Values

- Visual Quality
- Cultural Heritage Values
- Soils
- Wildlife Habitat – Moose, Grizzly Bear, Fisher, Species at Risk.
- Fire and Forest Health
- Recreation and Access Management
- Riparian Areas, Fish and Watershed Quality / Stability

- Biodiversity – Stand / Landscape Level

Annual Allowable Cut (AAC)

2007 TSR

- Managed over a 5 year cut control period.
- 5 Year maximum cut of 200,000m³
 - Cumulative AAC
- 10% overcut eligible.
- Set by the Chief Forester
- Set at least once every 10 years.

2016 TSR



Annual Allowable Cut (AAC)

2007 TSR

- ECF Provided Third Party Assessment as part of Application
- 2007 Application Timber Supply Review
 - MPB Salvage Regime, AAC Should be 40,000m³ until Year 2148.
 - Then Reduced to 23,000m³ until recovery of Long Term Harvest Levels (~60 years).

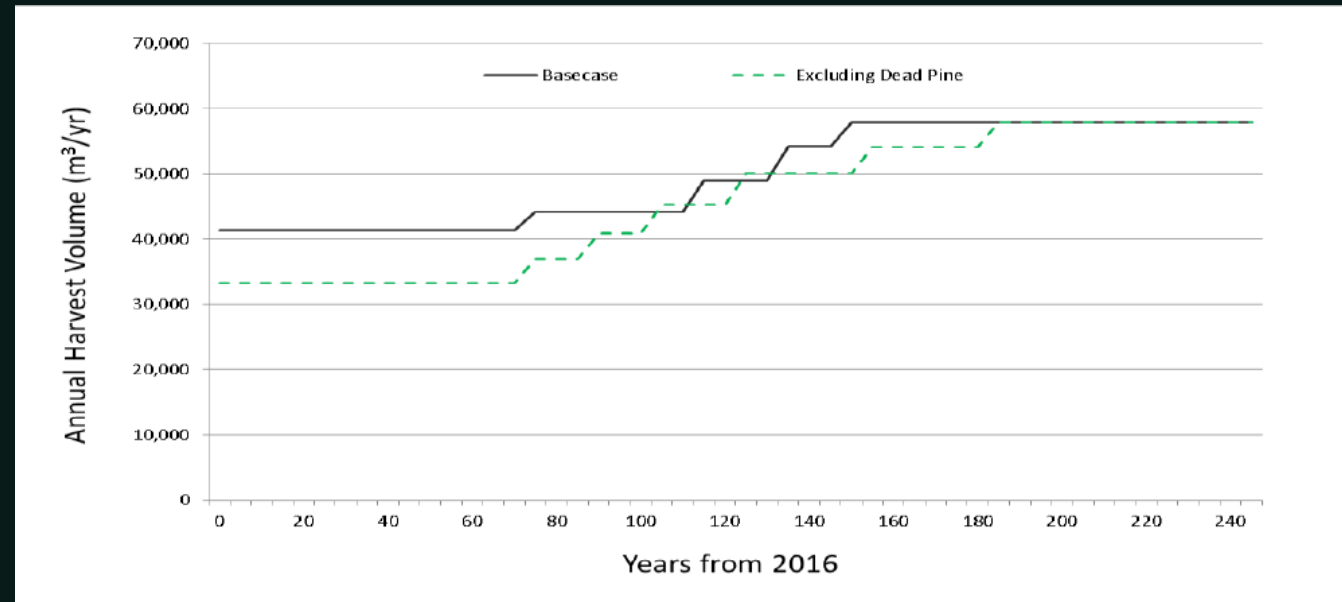




Annual Allowable Cut (AAC)

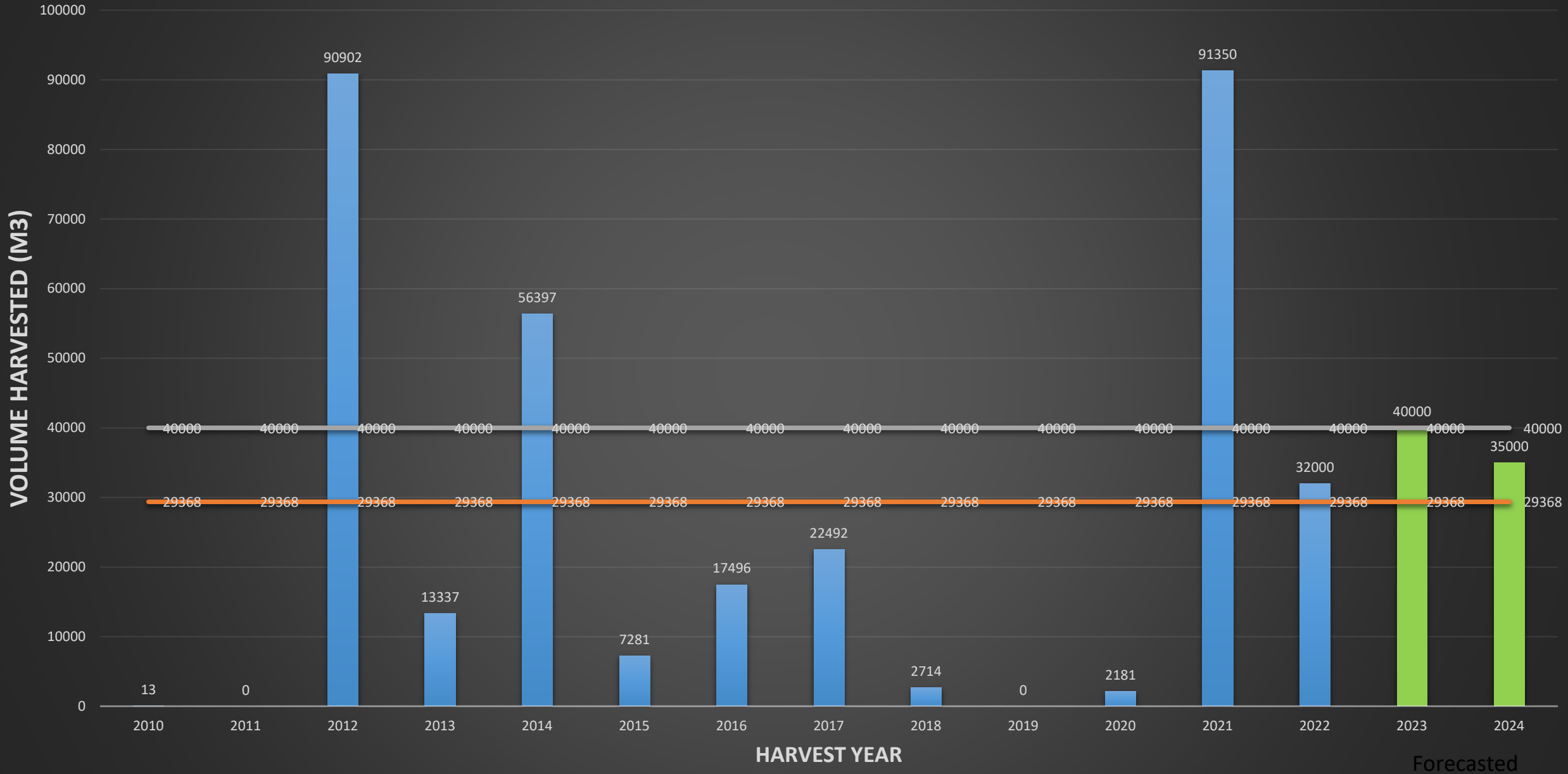
2007 TSR

- 2010 Province determined 40,000m³ sustainable AAC.
- ECF Initiated Second Review
 - 2016 AAC Timber Supply Review
 - Incorporated Updated FSP Management strategies
 - 33,300m³ excluding MPB.
 - 41,400m³ with MPB

ECF Total Harvested m3/Year





Future Cut Levels

- Intend to manage the current Cut control Period to 200,000m³ to capture high market conditions.
- Review AAC in fourth cut control Period (2025-2029)

Future Cut Levels

- Include New inventory methods using LiDAR
- Work Ongoing
 - Identify Community Values.
 - Identify Low Productivity Timber Sites.
 - Increased Community Input from shareholders
 - Consultation with TSR specialists and Government for timing of next TSR.
